## **Time To Be Me**

### The low levels of wellbeing of children can have a great impact on their childhood and life chances.

Without the experience of happiness and a sense of wellbeing in our lives, it is difficult to thrive and to become the best we can. Our service provides a safe and secure environment in which children are able to share and explore emotions, thoughts, and feelings through the therapeutic activities that we offer. We help those children who have negative emotions deal with them without repressing or denying them by encoruaging positivity, building self-esteem and resilience.

In our Time To Be Me session the children loved the sessions. We provided both physical and craft activities. We made Easter wreaths, Easter Baskets and chocolate nests to collect eggs on a Easter Egg hunt. Children then took part in an Easter egg and spoon race, hunted for eggs and joined in with bunny hop races! Craft activities and physical activities are good for our emotional health as well as physical.



# Travelling a long way to find something familiar

I spent all of last week in Wick in the far northeast of Scotland and only 14 miles from John O Groats. That is around 420 miles from west Cumbria.

Remarkably, I found a Nuclear facility close by at Dounreay, I found a town with a busy harbour, in Wick, and I found an amazing Family Centre like a very large Howgill. In a strange way, it did not feel like I was away from home although, what was different was that Sellafield is ten times as big as Dounreay and Wick is smaller than Whitehaven and yet, by contrast, the Pulteney Centre was much bigger than Howgill.

Being curious about these matters, I went to visit the Pulteney Centre and found a Nursery and a Play Group but also found a foodbank, a community cafe and old people preparing lunch for other old people. It serves the whole community as they say, 'from cradle to grave'. It is also open all day with community activities in the evening, including films, it provides a community meal one evening and it even opens on Saturday evening, exclusively for young people.

What we certainly have in common is that Dounreay supports the Pulteney Centre and Sellafield very generously supports Howgill. Both are excellent examples of local industries supporting key community projects.

I have already established a regular email contact with Pulteney so that we can learn from each other and, very importantly, help our local industries understand how they can better support their local communities.

# Howgill Family Centre, Cleator Moor

In the Zoo Room, our babies been learning lots of new nursery rhymes. The children took such a good interest in learning about dinosaurs. We had mash and broccoli in the tuff tray. We also had a sensory week where we got really messy in the shaving foam. Our children loved new sensory bottles. As we have been reading 'The Shark in the Park' we have accompanied this with the familiar song 'Baby Shark'. They have all enjoyed celebrating the King's coronation.

This term in the 2's Under The Sea room we have been very creative and explorative. Recently we have planted seeds for our 'Jack and the Beanstalk ' topic that the children have took great interest in their growth. We have done some 'nonlinear' investigation and designed our own worms and ladybirds. The children have also had lots of fun during the celebrations of the King's Coronation. A lovely tea party was enjoyed with some of the children own crowns and flag creations.

In Preschool this term our main topic has been Spring. We have been learning about new life such as lambs and chicks. We have explored the life cycle of caterpillars through our story "The Very Hungry Caterpillar". The children have been focusing on gross motor movement in our outdoor area by moving around like different minibeasts. We have also been developing our fine motor skills by threading bobbins and using tweezers to help support.
